f you've purchased a few more Sanibel and Captiva goodies than your suitcases will hold, fear not. You can pack it yourself and stand in line at the post office—or let one of three local shipping companies take care of it for you. They are ready, able, and willing to help you get your treasures from here to there.

Family-owned and -operated **Arundel's**, located at Heart of the Islands Plaza on Sanibel, is open seven days a week. Not only can the store ship anything but Arundel's can track its progress with a high-tech computer system. Arundel's offers photo finishing, as well as fax and Internet service. The store also has a selection of greeting cards, gifts, photo albums, party supplies, and more. Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. *Arundel's*, 1626 Periwinkle Way, Sanibel, 239/472-0434.

Another way to get your goods from Sanibel is to stop by Pak n Ship. With a full selection of packing goods, Pak n Ship assures you needn't have your items packed before you arrive. "We sell office, packaging, moving, and storage supplies," says owner Gene Routh. Customers can also send and receive faxes, rent mailboxes, or subscribe to a mail forwarding service. Served by UPS, FedEx, FedEx Ground, and Airborne, Pak n Ship also has a Captiva location at South Seas Resort that is open to the public. The Captiva location operates seven days a week; the Sanibel store is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday. You can't miss the delivery trucks coming and going at **Qwik Pack & Ship** on Periwinkle Way at Casa Ybel Road. Take in whatever you like—these guys have seen it all. Qwik Pack & Ship sells a full assortment of packing supplies, so prepacking is not necessary. This is also the place to make a copy, or send or receive a fax, and owner Dolores Malenock has private mailboxes for those wanting to avoid the crowds at the Sanibel post office. "We

use UPS, FedEx, Airborne and truck freight," says Malenock. If she's not busy, ask her to tell you about some of the stranger things she's shipped, like red velvet cakes, dirty laundry, and a (very heavy) box of sand.
